Definitions

Sexual Misconduct

Sexual misconduct is an umbrella term that encompasses sexual harassment, sexual violence, rape, sexual assault, stalking, bullying and domestic violence.

Sexual Assult

Sexual Assault is any type of sexual contact or behavior that occurs without the explicit consent of the recipient. It includes attempted rape, rape, forcible sodomy, and unwanted touching.

Domestic Violence

Domestic Violence includes offenses committed by the victim's current or former spouse, current or former cohabitant, or anyone else protected under domestic or family violence law. Domestic Violence can be physical, sexual, emotional, economic, or psychological actions or threats of actions that influence another person. This includes any behavior that intimidate, manipulate, humiliate, isolate, frighten, terrorize, coerce, threaten, blame, hurt, injure, or wound.

Bullying

Bullying has two key components: Repeated harmful acts and an imbalance of power. It involves repeated physical, verbal, or psychological attacks or intimidation directed against a victim who cannot properly defend themselves because of size or strength or because the victim is outnumbered or less psychologically resilient.

Stalking

Stalking is a pattern of repeated and unwanted attention, harassment, contact, or any other course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to feel fear.

Sexual Assult

If you are the victim of sexual assault it is recommended that you do the following:

- Go to Mercy Medical Center (301 St. Paul St.) for a SAFE (Sexual Assault Forensic Exam) within 96 hours of the assault for evidence collection.
- Do not bathe, shower, or brush your teeth
- Do not eat or drink
- Place all clothing in a brown paper bag

Interim Measures

Amnesty

The University recognizes that a student who is under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs at the time of an incident may be hesitant to make a report because of the threat of disciplinary sanctions for his or her own violation of the Code of Student Conduct. A student who reports sexual misconduct, either as a complainant or third party witness, will not face disciplinary charges under the Code of Student Conduct
