Your IRS income information is available two weeks after filing electronically and eight weeks after filing a paper return. The **IRS Data Retrieval Tool** will *not* be available under the following circumstances and additional action or documentation may be required:

Circumstance	Required Action and/or Documentation
A joint tax return was filed for 2015 and the student or the student's parents have filed the FAFSA with a marital status of separated, divorced or widowed.	 Tax Return Transcript W-2 for person whose information is being used to determine financial aid eligibility
The tax filer is married to someone other than the individual included on the 2015 joint tax return.	 Tax Return Transcript for couple who filed jointly W-2 for person whose information is being used to determine financial aid eligibility and who has since remarried. Tax Return Transcript for new spouse
The parent or student was not married in 2015 but is married at the time the FAFSA is filed.	 The current spouse's income must be reported on the FAFSA. Tax Return Transcripts for both spouses.
The parents or the student is married but filed tax returns separately.	Tax Return Transcripts for both spouses
An amended tax return was filed.	 A transcript from the IRS that lists tax account information of the tax filer and Signed copy of the amended return (1040X)

Identity Theft	 A tax filer who is unable to obtain an IRS Tax Return Transcript because of IRS identity theft, calls a special IRS group at 1-800-908-4490 Upon verification of identity, the tax filer can obtain a paper copy of the Tax Return Data Base View (TRDBV). The TRDBV is an official transcript that can be submitted to the school to meet verification requirement A signed and dated statement from the tax filers that they are victims of IRS tax-related identity theft and that the IRS has been made aware of this



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
