Individuals invited to speak are recognized experts in their chosen fields. The forum seeks inspirational professionals of integrity who are impactful, have overcome significant obstacles, and have delivered dramatic success. The series focuses on professionals with these strengths to present strong role models who can set a standard of achievement for the Notre Dame community. This is the 21st anniversary of the Charles J. Busta III Business Forum.

#### **CHARLES J. "CB" BUSTA III**

This forum was created in memory of Charles J. "CB" Busta—a Notre Dame trustee and Baltimore-based cosmetics industry executive who died in 1999—as a platform for inspiring business leaders to encourage creativity and personal growth.

CB began his career as a teacher in the Ohio school system, where he educated students in the skills required to interface with the rapidly changing, late-1960s business world. In 1970, he was named the region's Teacher of the Year. In 1976, CB was hired by the Noxell Corporation, where he was integral in expanding the company's Cover Girl line and advanced to become Vice President of Marketing. In 1996, CB took a position with Revlon's Professional Care U.S. division, which he led as Executive Vice President and General Manager until his sudden death in 1999. He is survived by Bonnie and Carly Busta, his wife and daughter, and his granddaughter, Coco. In Bonnie's words, "CB was a simple man who worked very hard toward his success and the success of others. He never forgot people along the way, encouraging and enabling many to fulfill their dreams."
