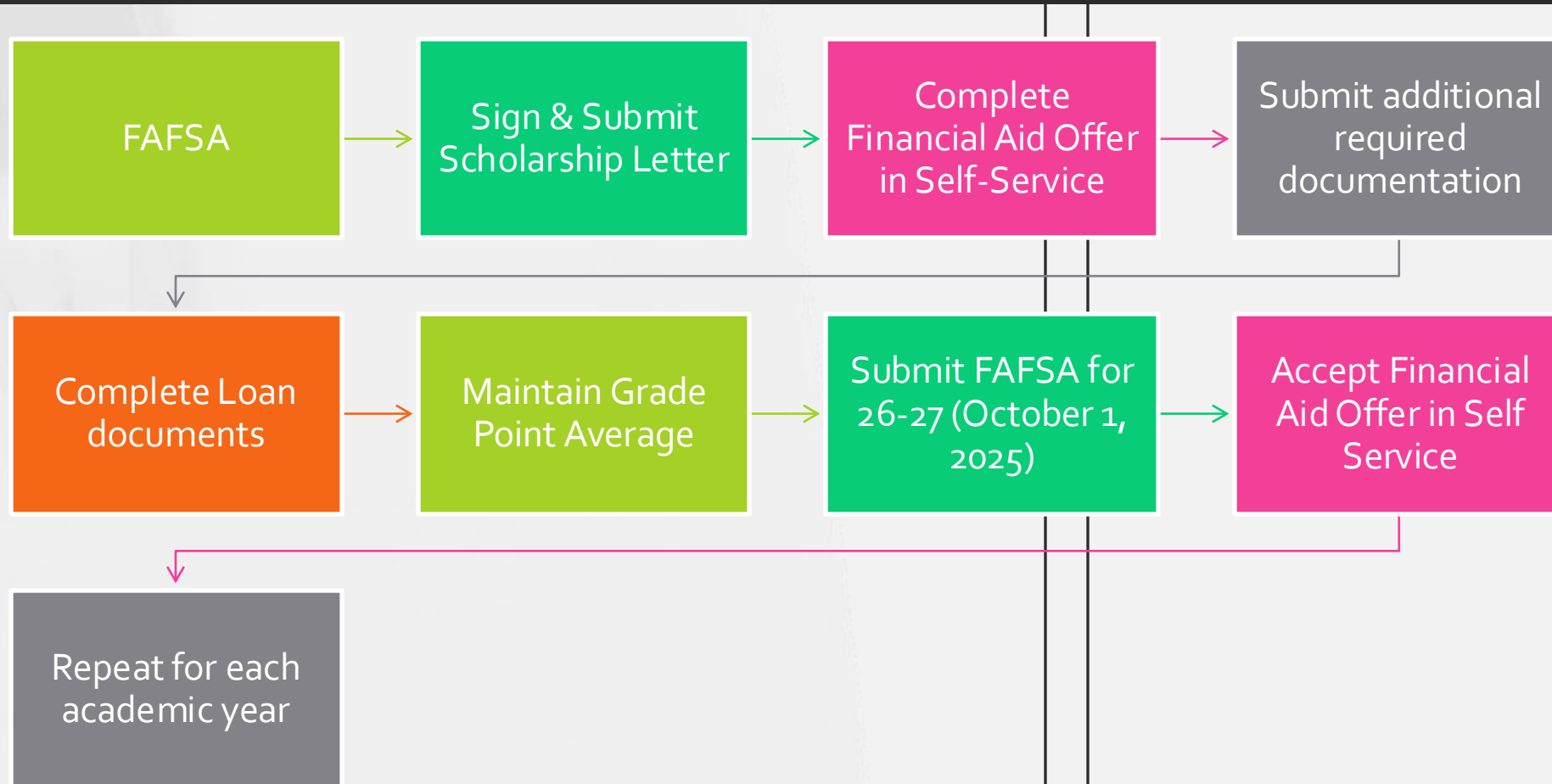

Students are responsible for:

- Completing the FAFSA
- Submitting additional Information (when requested)
- Completing Offer in self-service
- Maintaining Minimum GPA for Federal Funding
- Maintaining Minimum GPA for NDMU Scholarships

Parents are responsible for:

- Providing necessary documentation as needed by the student.

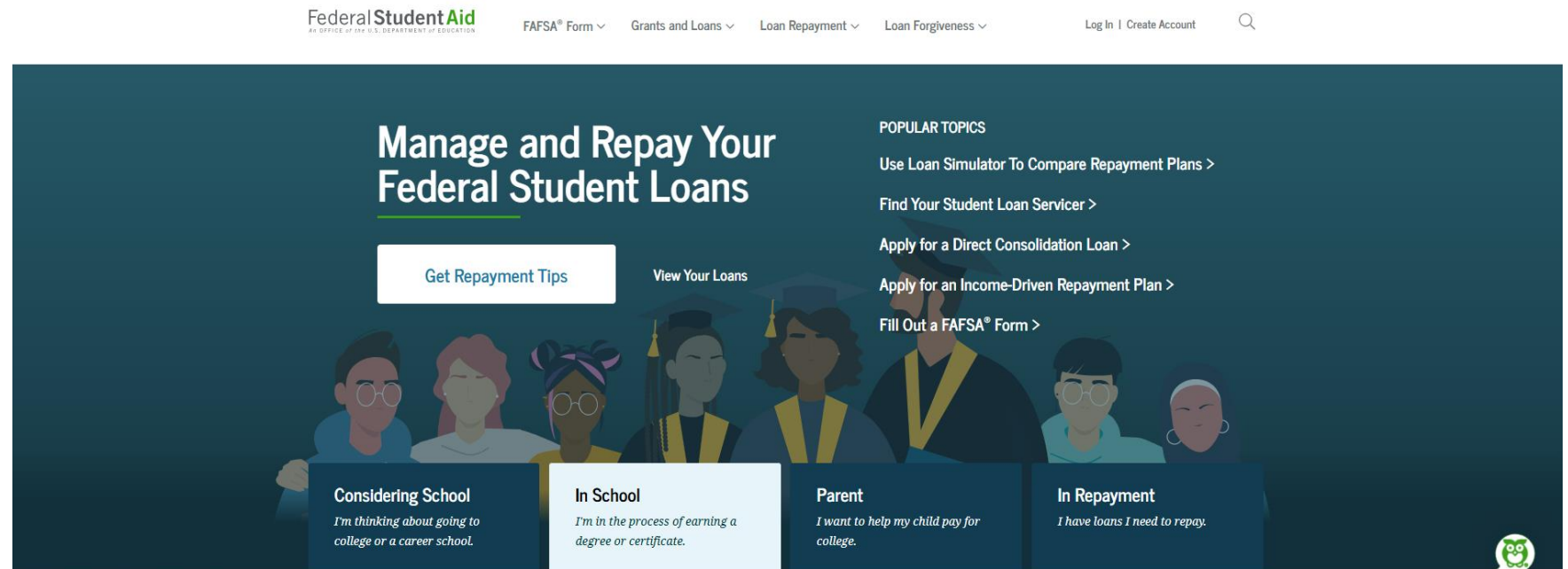

Always apply directly to the source when possible (ie: if the scholarship is sponsored by Google, use the application on the Google Website rather than a third party)

# WHEN IS FINANCIAL AID POSTED TO ACCOUNTS?

Students can expect their financial aid to be disbursed to their student financial account after the add/drop period has ended for the students' program. This timing allows for students to adjust schedules and be sure they are registered for full-time. (12+ credits)

\* students not registered full-time, SOME funds may still be available.



## Refunds:

- Issued within 14 days of disbursement
- Issued by the business office

## Requirements for disbursement:

- Students must be registered as a full-time student.\*
- Have submitted all required documentation
- Accepted aid in self-service

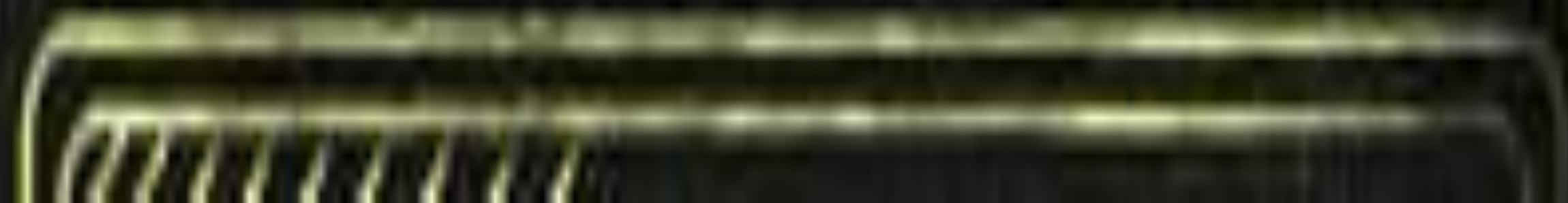
