Graduation rate: Percentage of students that complete the academic program and received a bachelor's degree within a period of 6 years.

Recipients: Students receiving and using their Pell Grant or Subsidized Direct loan. These students must receive and use the award within their first year at the institution. If the student is a recipient of an award at a later point, they would not be included in one of the subcohorts. (IPEDS definition)

Completion or graduation rate of certificate or degree-seeking, first-time, full-time, undergraduate students.

Data are to be available by July 1 each year for the most recent cohort that has had 150 percent of normal time for completion by August 31 of the prior year . 34 CFR 668.41(a) - (d); 34 CFR 668.45; 34 CFR 668.8(b)(1)(ii)
