

## HONOR CODE

The Honor Code of Notre Dame of Maryland University has been a tradition since 1926 when unproctored tests were initiated. It is founded on a pledge each student takes to act with integrity in academic and personal life.

Based on the personal integrity of the individual and an active concern for others, the Honor Code is motivated by personal values, religious conviction, good taste and mutual trust. The Honor code signifies the ideal of academic and personal integrity that each student is expected to model. Living the Honor Code strengthens the entire community and cultivates an atmosphere of unity founded on trust.

The Honor Code is based on the personal integrity of the individual. Academic honesty assumes that all work submitted as one's own is, in fact, one's own; therefore:

- 1. Examinations and tests are generally unproctored.
  - a. A signed pledge on all tests and on all assignments will confirm the student's intention of academic honesty. Students write: "I hereby affirm that I have neither given nor received help on this exam, paper or assignment. (Signature)
  - b. To safeguard the student, all class materials will be left in designated areas and, whenever possible, adequate space will be left between students.
  - c. When a student leaves an exam room during the course of taking the exam, he or she is to indicate this and the period of time of absence on the exam paper which is to be handed in.
  - d. If a faculty member has definite reason to believe that cheating is going on in his/her class, he/she has the option to proctor tests and /or exams.
  - e. All exams must be handed directly by the students to the faculty member in charge of administering the exam.
  - f. No conversation will be permitted during the testing period.
- 2. Violations of the academic code include, but are not restricted to:
  - a. Cheating in any type of test
  - b. Plagiarism by presenting material of others as one's own without giving due credit
  - c. Misrepresentation in bibliography and footnotes
  - d. All electronic forms of dishonesty, e.g., lending someone your Notre Dame ID card, or dishonest use of computer facilities and accounts.

Your signed pledge will become part of your student file. Please sign this pledge and return it to the Notre Dame staff before leaving campus today.
