

NDMU Guest Policy for Housing and Residence Life –Fall 2022

Effective August 16, 2022, non-residential students, including commuters and outside guests will be allowed in all areas of the residence halls.

The guidelines below are highlighted for their importance in maintaining health and safety within our community:

- Residents are allowed to have 2 guests at any time
- The guest must be at least 18 years old
- Residents with roommates/suitemates MUST inform their roommate/suitemate if they plan to have a guest
 - Prior approval is needed from all roommates/suitemates in order to have any guest
- Length of guest stay:
 - **Day:** A guest may stay for the day (hours of visitation 7am-11pm)
 - **Overnight:** A guest may stay in a resident's room for no longer than one night (24hrs) in a seven-day period
- All guests must be registered via the Guest Housing and Residence Life link [here](#). The residential student must login and complete the form for their guest
- A copy of the guest's COVID vaccination card* must be uploaded along with photo identification (you need a state or government-issued ID) ***ONLY FOR NON NDMU GUESTS**
 - The guest must be [up to date](#) on COVID-19 vaccinations (i.e. completed primary vaccine series and boosted, if eligible) ***ONLY FOR NON NDMU GUESTS**
- The NDMU Residential Student is responsible for their guests' actions and must be with the guest at all times, while on campus

The continued impact of COVID-19 requires that the Guest Policy in the residence halls be strictly enforced. Therefore, all residents are strongly encouraged to review this policy carefully.

Violations of this policy will result in disciplinary action, including but not limited to warning, fines, housing probation and suspension from university housing.
